Candidates, Arrowmen, Scoutmasters & Unit Leaders,

My name is Jason F, and I am your 2024 Tamegonit Lodge Vice-Chief of Inductions. I, along with Luka H, the Nimat Chair, first and foremost, would like to thank you for your involvement in and support of the Order of the Arrow, the BSA's National Honor Society. This Saturday 41 Ordeal members of our Lodge will seal their membership by becoming Brotherhood members in the Order of the Arrow as well as we will induct 192 new Ordeal members into our order. I encourage you to share this document with everyone attending the event and especially the Ordeal & Brotherhood candidates. Everyone on reservation will need to turn in a current BSA Health Form (Part A & B), be checked in and have a wristband.

REGISTRATION:

Registration for all Candidates <u>begins</u> at 5:00 pm on Friday, May 10th. <u>It is only necessary to arrive and check in to be on time for your Ordeal or Brotherhood candidate check in times</u>. The location of registration is in the Dining Hall. Be sure you have your current BSA health form (Part A & B) when you come to check-in. We will verify your participants and review any payment discrepancies. **There are no refunds for no shows at OA events.**

WHAT TO BRING/WHERE TO GO WHEN YOU ARRIVE AT CAMP:

After Checking in at the Dining Hall, Ordeal Candidates should report to the Campfire Arena and await further instruction. PLEASE BE ON TIME!!!

Ordeal Candidates are urged to bring the following properly packed in a backpack Scoutmasters and/or OA Assistant Scoutmasters, please guide your candidates appropriately:

- BSA Health form (Part A & B)
- Plastic ground cloth
- Sleeping bag
- Pillow
- Full Scout Uniform
- Work clothes and gloves
- Backpack
- Flashlight (optional)
- Medication (if needed)
- Poncho/rain gear
- Canteen/water bottle
- Personal Hygiene items

Brotherhood Candidates after checking in at the Dining Hall, should set up their tent in the North Meadow (the area near the Maintenance Barn), men on the Maintenance Barn side of the road, south of the Climbing Tower/Rocket Launch Road, females on north side of the Climbing Tower/Rocket Launch road and then report in their field uniform with OA sash to campsite Cheyenne based on your designated District Ceremony time as noted in the schedule. PLEASE BE ON TIME!!! General Arrowmen camping will also be in North Meadow (the area near the Maintenance Barn) following the same side of the road protocols as the Brotherhood Candidates.

Brotherhood Candidates should study the Brotherhood Membership Questions and Answers found in the National OA Handbook and write their letter of rededication prior to their arrival at camp. The Nimat Chair has created a study guide for the Brotherhood candidate that can be found here Brotherhood Study Guide (the password is the Ordeal Admonition you received during your Ordeal Ceremony) that includes the same information. Brotherhood candidates are expected to wear their Field Uniforms to Ceremonies. Brotherhood members will be expected to serve the Lodge on Saturday. The Brotherhood hikes and Ceremony will take place Saturday afternoon. Brotherhood candidates must have also paid their 2024 Tamegonit Lodge Dues prior to arriving at the Induction event. New Brotherhood members can gather membership-related information on Saturday afternoon at Arrowmen 202.

WALK-IN REGISTRATION:

Absolutely NO walk-in registration will be allowed. Any walk-in may register for a future Induction event and will then be asked to go home.

Special Needs requests are now part of the online registration process. If you did not submit, please notify us during your check in and we will do our best to accommodate your request.

TEXT ALERTS:

We will be utilizing a free text messaging service to keep leaders on reservation up to date and informed of any changes. We ask that all adults sign up for the texting service before or upon arrival. Text o24spring-2 to 81010 to receive important alerts of schedule changes and reminders throughout the day.

WEATHER & OTHER EMERGENCIES:

If we must enact any emergency procedures this weekend, we will utilize shelters throughout Camp Naish. Please follow the directions of the youth that will be in charge. PLEASE PREPARE FOR KANSAS WEATHER; RAIN GEAR, JACKETS, GLOVES, HATS AND LAYERS OF CLOTHING ARE ALL APPROPRIATE FOR THE WEEKEND. We will continue to track forecasts and use all our resources to keep everyone safe in the case of severe weather or other potential emergencies.

PARKING/CARPOOLING:

We STRONGLY RECOMMEND that you carpool. We need everyone, while following the Guide to Safe Scouting, to fill vehicles with as many people and as much gear as possible. Parking is always at a premium at Camp Naish! Please follow the directions of the young men/women and advisers running the parking process. They are there to ensure safety, first and foremost, and orderly and efficient use of space in our limited parking lots. It's also helpful for traffic flow to continue moving as directed rather than stopping to discuss a parking issue. We appreciate your help to make parking just a little bit easier! UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL PARKING BE ALLOWED ALONG ANY ROADS; THE ROADS MUST BE CLEAR OF VEHICLES TO ALLOW FOR POTENTIAL EMERGENCY VEHICLE ENTRY AND EXIT. WE ASK THAT YOU ALSO AVOID PARKING ON ANY GRASSY AREAS ON RESERVATION. Camp Naish reserves the right to tow any cars violating this policy at the car owner's expense. If you are parking in Clark's Fork, we would ask you to avoid parking in front of the burn pile. The staff helping park you are working to make sure that everyone gets in safely and that roads are accessible for any emergency vehicle; please work cooperatively with them to ensure everyone gets into camp in a safe and timely manner.

DRIVING AT CAMP:

Driving MUST be kept to an absolute minimum once you've arrived. Please adhere to ALL speed limits on the Reservation. Camp vehicles, permitted staff vehicles and camp Kubota's should be the only vehicles transporting anything for work projects and/or emergency procedures.
